

#### **New - Demonstration Area at Hard Rock Summit**

The DGMS recently received an extra meeting room and we are thinking about using it for a demonstration area to showcase lapidary, gem cutting, cabochon polishing, jewelry making, silversmithing, wire wrapping, flint knapping, field collecting equipment, or anything else related to our hobby if we get enough interest. We will have donated equipment that can be used or you can bring your own. The Convention Center will allow the use of water as long as we put plastic on the carpet and do not make a mess. No fires or gas cylinders will be allowed; however, we will check with the fire department to see if use of a soldering iron will be allowed. We need to determine if we have enough volunteers to do demonstrations throughout the 4-day show, so please see the online volunteer signup information below to indicate if you would like to do a demonstration and which day(s) you are available.

#### **Volunteers Needed**

We will still need volunteers for the DGMS, as well as the Evolution and Sparkle & Joy Shows. Volunteers are required to work a minimum of 2 hours and will get free admission (admission will be \$10/day) to the Convention Center shows for that day and free parking in the parking garage (normally \$12 per day) adjacent to the Convention Center. #### Colorado Convention Center Rules

**No food or drink** can be brought into the Convention Center. There are food vendors in the Center for purchases of food or drink.

There **will not** be a hospitality area for the club volunteers at the show.

**No carts** will be allowed on the convention center floor. If you have large or heavy items to carry into the show, such as your club's grab bags, they must be taken to the dock area. They will be put on a pallet and taken to the show floor by union workers.

Items may be hand carried or brought in by use of a wheeled suitcase. You may need to make multiple trips.





### 2021 Denver Gem and Mineral Show Volunteer Sign-up

The 2021 Denver Gem and Mineral Show will be at the Colorado Convention Center from September 16-19, 2021 in downtown Denver as part of the Hardrock Summit and Evolution Show. Thursday, Friday, Saturday, and Sunday 10am-5pm. Identify in Question box what you plan to demonstrate and if there are specific times during the day that is preferable.

**Information Booth** – Sitting position to answer questions and direct people to shows. Thursday, Friday, Saturday, and Sunday 9am-6pm

**Volunteer Sign In Table** – Sitting position to sign in volunteers and hand out badges and work assignments. Thursday, Friday, Saturday, and Sunday 9am-5pm


#### FIND THE BALANCE POINT

With odd-shaped pendants or earrings it's often difficult to find the right place to attach a bail or loop so that the piece is balanced and hangs straight.

A quick way to make a tool for this is to modify a set of tweezers. Any set of tweezers will work. Spread the tips, sharpen them with a file, and bend the tips at a right angle to point towards each other.

To use the tool, suspend the pendant or earring between two sharp points to see how it will hang.


The New DGMG Website - by DGMG Webmaster Bob Johnson

The 10-year-old DGMG website is back to its old address: **DENVERGEM.org** but the address denvergem.co.education will redirect you there.

Many additional pages will be added to the site in the coming months.

Here are the procedures for logging into the new Members Only area.



On the top menu, click on Login.

Enter your email address as your username.

Be sure to use the same email address that is listed in the club roster – the email address used to send you the Tips & Chips.

If you have forgotten your password, or if this is your first time logging into the new site, click on "Forgot password" and the system, after asking for your email address again, will automatically send you an email with a link to create your new password.

Please keep our members area secure for everyone by using a strong password.

The system will suggest a password. You can use that one, or enter your own.

The *Members Only* area currently contains the most recent members directory in both excel and PDF format, and the DGMG photo albums. There are nearly 200 different albums which contain pictures that go all the way back to 1964 – our founding year.

Clicking on an album name will open that album in Google Photos. The initial album view will show all the pictures in the album (you may need to scroll down to see them all). Clicking on any picture will open a larger view of that one picture and from that view you can scroll left or right to see the individual pictures. To save any picture to your computer, just right click on it and select "save image as". From the Album view, you can click on the 3 dots (in the top menu) to download the whole album.




#### Web Corner – Web and Computer Resources for Rockhounds (con't.)

At the bottom of the screen, you will see a button that says "Say something" Click on that button to leave a comment (about the whole album - from the album view or about an individual picture - from the picture view). You are encouraged to leave your comments and share your stories about these pictures!

The menu at the top of the picture view gives you additional options. The circled "i" will display additional information about that image, and the 3 dots will allow you to order prints, download, or view the pictures as a slideshow.
