

October 2 —Field trip to club claim

MAP TO WIGWAM CREEK CLAIMS FROM JEFFCO 126



Going to the claims is a doable day trip from Denver. Allow an hour and a half for the drive. Take JeffCO 126 south from Highway 285 at Pine Junction. Turn right on the Wigwam Creek Road, just past the trailhead at the bottom of 6-Mile Hill. From there follow the map.

The roads going into the claims from the south are passable with a passenger vehicle; however the road going north between Wellington Lake and Bailey is very rutted and washed out; too difficult for a low-riding vehicle. At the claims, park north of the road in a graveled parking lot.

Camping is permitted by DGMG members on the claim. NO FIRES. We don't want to look like the Hayman fire burn area to the south or the Buffalo Creek fire burn area to the east!



October birthstone- Opal, variety Hyalite


Hyalite is a form of common or "potch" opal which does not have the spherical internal structure or usual play-of-color. It is often clear and colorless, closely resembling a piece of glass. Hyalite Opals are also known by the names Muller's Glass, Waterstone, and Grape Opal.

However, some 'electric' Hyalite Opals have some minute inclusions or trace elements which cause a fluorescent green glow in certain light conditions. The element in this case is **uranyl** which is a residue of uranium. Studies have shown that the greenish fluorescence is from ultraviolet excitation of the uranyl impurities within the Hyalite Opal. Hyalite Opals that are almost colorless or a very pale yellow or green can explode into an electric, almost ethereal, glowing green color in direct sunlight or ultraviolet light.

In most cases, Hyalite Opals are left as rough stones and collected by enthusiasts as mineral curiosities. Some colorless and clear examples can


be tumbled to clean them up a bit or they are cut and polished into cabochons but without color they are not particularly exciting to most customers. Any Hyalite gemstones which display the fluorescent or luminescent phenomenon, that are large enough and transparent enough, can be faceted into treasured gemstones. Very few Hyalite Opals are to be found much bigger than a carat or two and the vast majority are just fractions of carats in size. In addition around 60-80% of the rough material is wasted when faceted.



In-Person and On Line Meeting and votes taken afterwards

Attendance: No count of attendance was taken. Approximately 20 and three new members.

These minutes are items that have been taken from e-mails between members that were able to attend the meeting. They are, basically, a listing of the items discussed in those e-mails.

Pete Modreski has agreed to teach a mineralogy course for the Guild via ZOOM; perhaps, twice weekly for eight weeks. Motion made by Beth: The DGMG accept Pete's offer to teach a mineralogy course via zoom, starting date and frequency of meetings to be at his discretion; the course will go into the 2022 year. Motion seconded by George Daggett; board members responded positively to the motion. Beth indicated that a January starting time will give Pete more time to prepare for the course. DGMG members voted to approve the move of meetings and the Christmas event to the Wheat Ridge United Methodist Church, 38th and Wadsworth, Wheat Ridge.

Beth also moved to award Karlene Fry a life membership in the Guild. Passed by the board.

Dave Sanchez and **Beth Simmons** presented the program, "Jaspers," for the September 10 meeting and included a small kit of types of jaspers. Recording available on the DGMG webpage.

Plans are being made to have "combination" meetings, in the future - in-person and on-line (ZOOM) to accommodate those members who cannot attend in person.

The meeting was adjourned effective September 26.


The New DGMG Website - by DGMG Webmaster Bob Johnson

Many additional pages will be added to the site in the coming months.

Here are the procedures for logging into the new Members Only area.



On the top menu, click on Login.

Enter your email address as your username.

Be sure to use the same email address that is listed in the club roster – the email address used to send you the Tips & Chips.

If you have forgotten your password, or if this is your first time logging into the new site, click on "Forgot password" and the system, after asking for your email address again, will automatically send you an email with a link to create your new password.

Please keep our members area secure for everyone by using a strong password.

The system will suggest a password. You can use that one, or enter your own.

The *Members Only* area currently contains the most recent members directory in both excel and PDF format, and the DGMG photo albums. There are nearly 200 different albums which contain pictures that go all the way back to 1964 – our founding year.

Clicking on an album name will open that album in Google Photos. The initial album view will show all the pictures in the album (you may need to scroll down to see them all). Clicking on any picture will open a larger view of that one picture and from that view you can scroll left or right to see the individual pictures. To save any picture to your computer, just right click on it and select "save image as". From the Album view, you can click on the 3 dots (in the top menu) to download the whole album.




Web Corner – Web and Computer Resources for Rockhounds (con't.)

At the bottom of the screen, you will see a button that says "Say something" Click on that button to leave a comment (about the whole album - from the album view or about an individual picture - from the picture view). You are encouraged to leave your comments and share your stories about these pictures!

The menu at the top of the picture view gives you additional options. The circled "i" will display additional information about that image, and the 3 dots will allow you to order prints, download, or view the pictures as a slideshow.
